FAQ: How do I install my Software on Mac or Linux?

You can install Meridian software on a Mac using bootcamp, or run it on OS X using parallel or wine. On Linux you should use the version of Wine located in your distribution's repository. Wine is recommended as it is free and allows you to use the machines native operating system and run Windows applications. To install on Linux please use Wine in your distribution's repository.

For a good tutorial on installing Wine on a Mac please read www.davidbaumgold.com/tutorials/wine-mac you can download MacPorts for SnowLeopard needed for the installation of Wine mentioned in the tutorial here. Once you have Wine installed you can then install your Meridian software using Wine in the same way as the instructions supplied with your software state. For more information on Wine please visit www.winehq.org.

There are also several commercial solutions for the installation of Windows applications on other operating systems. These can be very easy to install and use but you have to pay for them, such as: <http://www.codeweavers.com/products/cxmac/>

Alternatively you can use the well-known, but expensive, option of Parallels which requires you to have a genuine copy of MS Windows. This is basically an advanced virtualisation solution and saves the hassle of dual-booting.
